

## BOOK TALK ACTIVITY –REPORT

A **book talk** in the broadest terms is what is spoken with the intent to convince someone to read a book. Book talks are traditionally conducted in a classroom setting for students; however, book talks can be performed outside a school setting and with a variety of age groups as well. It is not a book review, a book report, or a book analysis.

The book talker gives the audience a glimpse of the setting, the characters, and/or the major conflict without providing the resolution or denouement. Book talks make listeners care enough about the content of the book who want to read. A long book talk is usually about five to seven minutes long and a short book talk is generally 180 seconds to 4 minutes long.
